

Player & Spectator Code of Conduct

- Revolution Sports is a social sports centre and therefore any anti-social behaviour by players or spectators will not be tolerated.
 - This includes (but is not limited to) offensive language, racism, sexism, homophobia, aggressive behaviour and unsportsmanlike conduct.
- Revolution Sports prohibits players from participating in games while intoxicated.
- In Senior Sport competitions, the Team Organiser is responsible for ensuring all players and spectators associated with their team abide by the Code of Conduct.
 - The Team Organiser is the only person who may approach the umpire for clarification of the application of a rule. Clarification may only be sought during the half-time break or at the end of the game.
 - Any further queries must be directed to the Venue Supervisor.
- In Junior Sport competitions, the Team Organiser is responsible for ensuring all players and spectators associated with their team abide by the Code of Conduct.
 - No person is permitted to approach the umpire at any time before, during or after a game.
 - The Team Organiser should approach the Venue Supervisor for clarification of the application of a rule, or to report a breach of the Code of Conduct by an opposition player or spectator.
 - Spectators are not permitted to approach opposition players or spectators to enforce the Code of Conduct. This should be left to the Venue Supervisor.
- Revolution Sports reserves the right to caution, suspend or ban a spectator, player or team from the competition for any anti-social behaviour, if deemed necessary.
 - Repeated displays of poor overall team behaviour may lead to the team being removed from the competition.
 - Players or teams who have been suspended or banned are not permitted to play any sport at Revolution Sports.
- The Code of Conduct is in place to ensure that all participants can be involved in an enjoyable and safe environment.
